Background

Dunn-St. Croix looking for an additional member (why?)

Approached Clear Lake in December

Internal discussions within the district and informal discussions at the Conference Superintendent levels

Goal: transparency, and respectful communication

"Fast Track" Process with WIAA = Two Years = 2025-2026 School Year

Key Points

- No decision has been made
- Not entirely Clear Lake's decision
- Football is not part of this
- Not a small decision to be taken lightly

Opportunities for Students

Enrollment

Travel Distances/Times

Intangibles: Cultural Fit, Familiarity, etc.

Lakeland Pros for Remaining

- History and Tradition
- C.L. enrollment on the larger side
- Traditional rivalries: TL, Clayton, PF, Shell Lake, etc.
- Many schools in conference, allows for "internal" realignment when needed for enrollment size changes
- Existing relationships with Lakeland schools: administration, coaches, ADs, etc.

Lakeland Cons for Remaining

- Many missed opportunities for Junior High and JV due to a lack of teams
- Geography: Long travel distances for many schools
- Competing with many smaller schools is not strengthening our programs
- 20+ schools = fragmented Conference identity at times
- Very little contact with the Eastern part of the conference, different CESA
- Instability: Disparity of enrollment sizes, continual realignment, many schools with declining enrollment

Examples

Several times: No JV Girls BB

Jr. High BB: Many Lakeland Teams Using 5th-6th Graders to Fill Rosters

Wrestling: Quads - CLHS Hosted: Teams there with 2 and 3 total wrestlers

Dunn-St. Croix Pros for Joining

- More consistent JV and Jr. High games in every sport
- More Conference Matches for Wrestlers
- Potential Natural Rivalries with neighbors: Glenwood, Boyceville, etc...
- Geography less travel distance overall
- Competitiveness of the conference may strengthen our programs
- Stability of the conference
- Similarity with other DSC schools: demographics, size, culture, academics
- Music conference alignment
- Existing relationships with DSC schools: administration, football conference, CESA 11, etc.

Dunn-St. Croix Cons to Joining

- C.L. enrollment on the smaller side over time
- Can we sustain competitiveness with our enrollment declining?
- Need to develop new relationships at some levels: coaches, athletic directors, administration
- Smaller number of schools means less flexibility for internal realignments, etc.

March 19 - Additional discussion at Lakeland Conference Superintendent Meetings

March 26 - Clear Lake Community Public Listening Session 6:30 p.m. Clear Lake High School Library

Time Frame and Steps

April 8 - Clear Lake Board of Education potential vote/decision

IF we wish to proceed with requesting to switch conferences:

April 16 - Discussion/request/vote at Lakeland Superintendents meeting

April - Discussion/vote at Dunn-St. Croix Superintendents meeting

If approved by Lakeland, then the Dunn-St. Croix would also have to vote to approve, and that would be submitted to the WIAA for the "fast track" two-year process. If not approved by Lakeland, Clear Lake could still apply to the WIAA for the change, but it would take 3-4 years to occur.
